As we head into registration season, we wanted to offer additional information on what to expect in terms of class placement and boat options for returning or prospective Pixel sailors.

Following registration PYC will group students based on parent request and instructor input. After the Pixel, the afternoon racing program basically breaks down into two classes and boat types:

Classes:                   1) Pixel Racing  
                                  2) Pixel Performance

Boat Type:                 Pixel (double handed)

Class 1 Description:     The Pixel Racing class is geared for sailors wanting to participate in the full compliment of Long Island Sound regattas (see schedule below). As such this class will focus on developing racing skills for crews and skippers. PYC will use its best efforts to pair up unmatched crews and skippers for regattas. However, it's always best to sign up as a team we recommend that you use the time between now and registration to arrange your own pairings. For your convenience a copy of last year's junior sailing roster is attached.

Class 2 Description:     The Pixel Performance class is geared for sailors who simply enjoy being out on the water and palling around with fellow sailors. As such this class emphasizes basic competency over racing skills. Students will be exposed to different positions (skipper and crew), pairings and even boats types throughout the summer. Participation at regattas is the exception, not the rule, but certainly an available option.

Boat Description:        The Pixel is JSA's designated double handed boat for the intermediate age group (12-14). It is a good stepping stone to the 420. The Pixel is just under 14 feet long and is typically sailed by two persons subject to a minimum combined weight of 190lbs. The Pixel flies a spinnaker in addition to a jib and main sail.

Rent vs. Own:            We have a limited number of Club-owned Pixels available for charter (2) with priority given to non-racing sailors (i.e. performance class). However, there can be an active private charter market depending on the year. Charter fees, whether

club or charter, can range between \$1,000 and \$1,200 depending on what's included (trailer, dolly, extra sails, etc.). These rates are per sailor per eight week season.

It can also pay to buy a boat and charter out to others in subsequent years or at alternate sailing times when your sailor is not in class (multiply all of the estimates above times two to reflect a minimum crew of two).

A new Pixel including trailer is priced at approximately \$8,000. A used Pixel with trailer can range between \$4,000 and \$6,800 depending on age and condition. The Boat Locker hosts an annual "Boat Swap" at which used boats are sold off by private owners (see dates below).
